## Thoughts from the Tees...

In church this past Sunday, we looked at Jesus' calling the first of the disciples and noticed that he started in Matthew's Gospel by picking four fishermen. I talked about the idea that Jesus was sending the message that his coming movement, the coming gospel, and his invitation to be his disciple was for all of the people regardless of the divisions that we tend to create.



During lunch following worship, someone offered another thought as to why Jesus started by selecting fishermen. Jesus knew his disciples would one day need to be able to tell others all they would see and learn by following Jesus. They would need to be able to tell stories, and who better to tell stories than fishermen? Now I don't know about you, but I laughed and thought it was funny and shared with the person, "That's a good way to look at it."

But you know it's more on target than you might think. The disciples were going to need to be able to share the experiences they would have following Jesus for several years, in essence to tell their stories in order for Jesus' message and ministry to spread. You and I are in the same situation as Jesus followers, but are we as good at telling stories as fishermen tend to be? You see, as we live our lives, we have our own experiences with God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and with those experiences come the opportunity to share them with others.

So here's the question, "How good are you at telling stories? What are the 'God experiences' of your lives? What have you learned about God and yourself, and what impact has it had on your life?"

As you start to answer some of these questions and others, you begin to recognize and organize your story so you can tell others. What stories can you tell, and how good a fisherman are you?






The congregation is looking forward to a spring Hand Chimes program. Want to participate? Stay tuned for more information.
